URUGUAY: Horacio TERRA GALLINAL Rodolfo SADAIN

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Ammesty International has now heard that the two politicians who remained in prison, Horacio Terra Gallinal and Rodolfo Sadain, were released from detention on 4 December 1982, although trial proceedings against them are still pending. They are accused of escarnio a las fuerzas armadas (disrespect for the armed forces).

Horacio Terra Gallinal and Rodolfo Sadain, both leading members of the Blanco party and candidates in the internal party elections which took place on 28 November 1982, were arrested on 20 October 1982 together with other members of the Blanco party and members of the Comision Nacional por El Voto en Blanco. All but Horacio Terra Gallinal and Rodolfo Sadain were subsequently released. Following their arrest, Horacio Terra Gallinal's and Rodolfo Sadain's names were excluded from the lists of candidates in the internal party elections. In the elections on 28 November 1982 a majority of the electorate voted for candidates of the Blanco party.

Amnesty International beleived that these men had been arrested and detained for the non-violent expression of their political opinions.

Further recommended action:

Urgent Action participants may write a further letter to the Uruguayan authorities welcoming the release of Horacio Terra Gallinal and Rodolfo Sadain, but urging that all charges against them be dropped.
